IMPORTANT PLANNING NOTES

1. Courses & semesters may be shifted, except fifth year. Student teaching in the senior year will be determined by coursework still needed for the major; most likely you will student teach in the second semester due to Spanish electives needed in the first semester. STEP fifth year student teaching must be completed in Semester II as indicated on the program plan.
2. Courses shaded in gray are co-requisites and must be taken as a block.
3. Prerequisites for EDU4251 & EDU4350 Student Teaching are: PSY2002, EDU3210, PSY3020, EDU3215.
4. *Regarding keyboard/piano or organ lessons, students beginning with MUS1001 and MUS1002/Keyboard for Classroom Teachers I & II take two additional semesters of private lessons. Students with keyboard background take three semesters of lessons and a semester of MUS3320/Music Technology.
5. †EDU3405/Individual Field Experience hours are due the first Friday after spring break.
6. Regarding Early Field Experiences, make sure to register for each in the proper semester. If you do not register for them, you cannot receive credit for them.
7. Fitness for Life and First Aid are required general education activity courses for all students.
8. × Spanish courses must be taken as scheduled. Spanish Immersion (SPN4011), 6 cr, may be taken after the sophomore or junior year. You should plan out your STEP major courses for your entire program as you register for sophomore classes. Required Spanish Major Courses are SPN2001, SPN2002, SPN2011, SPN2012, SPN3001, SPN3002, SPN3011, SPN4001, SPN4002, SPN4011, and EDU3301.
9. All students need 2 credits of a vocal/choral requirement. That can be met in the following ways:
 - MUSxxxx Choir – 4 semesters
or
MUS1103 Sight Singing Fundamentals
MUS1104 Vocal Skills
or
MUS1103 Sight Singing Fundamentals
MUSxxxx Choir – 2 semesters
or
MUS1104 Vocal Skills
MUSxxxx Choir – 2 semesters

(The previous requirement was fulfilled with MUS1101/Vocal Musicianship I and MUS1102/Vocal Musicianship II.)
